During the week we not only offer themed walks but a range of other activities in and around the village. Useful if your partner is a walker and you are not, or if you want a break from walking.

In the village there are lots of shops and eateries along with The Boscastle Pottery and The Witchcraft Museum. Buses regularly run through the village to local towns and coastal villages.

- ❖ Sketchbook Sessions with local artist and writer Deborah King. Learn to look closely at the environment and recreate what you find through art and the written word. £15 per person per session.
- ❖ Learn about photographic composition and pick up other tips for photographing the environment with renowned local artist Raymond. £8 per person.
- ❖ Join Helen Jagger for a stroll around the harbour area collecting your thoughts and observations which you will use in her workshop creating Japanese style poetry. £8 per person.
- ❖ The Wellington Hotel's Waterloo Restaurant annually hosts the Festival Meal providing a stunningly presented Dinner at £20 per person.
